A Letter From

Laura



It's that time of the year when I start to pull all of my financial records together so Sam can prepare our income tax returns. My goal is have them in such clear and easy to read fashion that I get no questions about anything. Muttering through the details, remembering last year's resolution to do this every quarter so the year is easy to close, listing every bit of income, expenses and the starting and ending mileage for the car, blah, blah, blah is not very interesting. I perk up when I get to the donations file because of our goal to increase our overall giving by at least 1% a year. Good friends give away 50% of their income to various charities. We're not there yet, but we are working towards it.

Thinking back to our first year as church members and the discussion about what to pledge, we decided that we needed to give enough that we noticed writing the check. Our 1984 church pledge was 25.00 a week. We've steadily increased our giving since then because when we give, we need to notice we're making the gift. This fall, our Presbytery's weekly e-letter had a series of stewardship messages from John Van Nuys, a pastor in Crawfordsville. He has a better way of helping people determine their pledge. He asks them to write down everything they spend on themselves in a week: prepared meals and take out, fancy coffee, movies, sporting events, other forms of entertainment...to keep track of each and every weekly expense and then pledge an amount to God that's at least equal to if not greater than what they spend on themselves.

Now that's just getting personal, isn't it? What a tool for accountability. We go out to eat once a week and pay someone to mow our lawn. Do we give more than that to FPCH each week? Yes. Do we also support Our Father's House, the special offerings and opportunities that come up during the year? Yes. Do we, like you, also support a variety of other good causes: the schools we've graduated from, foundations that do work we admire, organizations that work to eliminate illnesses that have killed people we love? Sure. We do it because everything we have comes to us from God anyway. What we have doesn't belong to us, nor do we want to be possessed by it. "We're just here for a little visit." is what a good friend always says.

It's about God, not about us, all day and every day. I'm sharing this with you because someone in the church told me he'd like to know where his pastor stands and what I practice. I think the spirit in which we give is what counts with God and I know that when I stand, in the end, before the judgment throne of Christ, I will answer for every excuse, every time I passed up an opportunity to be kind, every moment I took the easy rather than the faithful way. I am thankful for the constant ways in which God shapes, hones and sandpapers my life into a little better resemblance of who it is I am called to be. In this season of repentance and self reflection, I am grateful to God for being surrounded in ministry by so many faithful people also seeking God's will for our lives. To give back out of all we receive is a privilege and a joy without price.

The Session met on Monday, January 25th and conducted the following business:

Welcomed Rev. Gretchen Seidler Gibbs, Moderator of the presbytery's Missional Transformation Coordinating Team, to explain to the Session the details of the three year transformational process with the presbytery.

Heard from the Trustees about the asbestos abatement, repairs to the boiler pumps for zones 1 and 3, inspection of fire extinguishers and the anticipated six month check up on the stair lifts.

Decided Session responsibilities for 2010, elected Linda Mann as presbytery commissioner for the year and reviewed the 2010 budget for inclusion in the 2009 Annual report. The Session also prepared for the annual meeting.

The Session met on Monday, February 8th to decide whether to join in a covenant relationship with the presbytery and the Center for Parish Development. After thorough discussion, the Session voted not to enter this three year process at this time.

The Session met on Monday, February 22nd and conducted the following business:

Received minutes of the Session, the Annual meeting, Deacons, Trustees, B & F, Christian Nurture and Worship and Music.

Noted the deaths in January of Edward Brown and Barry McKnight.

The Session concurred with the recommendation of the Deacons that serving home communion on a quarterly basis is no longer serving our congregation and that we schedule home communion on an "as needed" basis by the pastor, assisted by elders or deacons.

The Session received the Personnel minutes, which include recommendations about summer vacations for the pastor and administrative assistant. We will schedule no committee or board meetings in July and the church office will be closed the week of July 19th. The pastor will take three weeks of her vacation in July and August.

The Session received the minutes of the quarterly meeting of MEF and their recommendation to approve two grant applications for use of the interest earned on the MEF in 2008 and 2009. One grant is for the asbestos abatement project, the other is to provide support for fellowship and connectional support within the congregation. An application will also be submitted by the Session for a Smock grant for this project related to seniors ministries.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned with prayer at 9:15 until the next meeting of March 22nd.

THE TOWN OF HIGHLAND PARTNERS WITH THE U.S. CENSUS BUREAU

The Town of Highland is partnering with the U.S. Census Bureau to spread the word about the 2010 Census and help achieve a complete and accurate count of the U.S. population. The following dates are important for a complete count of our citizens in Highland:

March 2010: 2010 Census forms are mailed or delivered to households.

March-April 2010: Be Counted Program is implemented. Census forms are available at select public sites for individuals who did not receive one by mail.

April 1, 2010: Census Day, the official day of the population count. All 2010 Census responses should represent the household as it exists on this day.

May-July 2010: Census workers will visit households that do not mail back their forms to take a count in person.

December 31, 2010: Census Bureau presents the 2010 apportionment counts to the President of the United States.

March 2011: Census Bureau completes delivery of redistricting data to states.

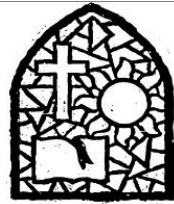
Pray for the work of the Holy Spirit within the life of FPCH and within each of us, that we may indeed be and make disciples in each new day.
